**BLACK CREEK TRIBUTARY BEHIND APPLETREE COURT AND SEELEY DRIVE
EROSION CONTROL AND SLOPE STABILIZATION PROJECT
CITY OF TORONTO**

Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA) has commenced a study to address riverine and valley slope erosion for a tributary of Black Creek between Seeley Drive and Sunfield Road following the July 8, 2013 severe weather event. In addition to the watercourse and adjacent infrastructure, the study also includes the property at 14 Appletree Court where ongoing slope failures and instability have created a risk to the single-family residential dwelling at the top of the slope.

Residents and other interested parties are invited to attend a Community Liaison Committee (CLC) meeting to find out more about the study, provide feedback on solutions being considered, and to discuss next steps in the process. You will have the opportunity to ask questions, speak with project staff, and provide your input in the planning and design process. Meeting details are as follows:

A Notice of Intent, formally initiating the Class Environmental Assessment process, was published in the North York Mirror on September 17, 2015.
