


CA Roles and Responsibilities

Role	Type of Role	Required or Voluntary	Representing	Result
Regulatory Agency	Decision making	Required	Provincial interests	Decision required
Delegated 'Provincial Interest'	Review/ Commenting	Required	Provincial interests	Comments must be considered
Public Commenting Bodies	Review/ Commenting	Depends on how role is defined	CA Board interests	Comments should be considered
Resource Management Agencies	Review/ Commenting	Voluntary	CA Board interests	Comments may be considered
Service Providers	Service	Terms of the Agreement	Terms of the agreement	Depends on terms of service agreement
Landowners	Review/ Commenting	Voluntary	CA Board interests	Comments may be considered

Sustainable Communities Policies (Section 6)

Advocacy Policies:

- Promote and encourage Living City program interests in planning and development
- Reflect TRCA's role as a scientific resource, a collaborator and supportive implementer
- Complement mandated responsibilities of natural heritage and natural hazard management
- Recommendations to approval authorities



Environmental Planning Policies (Section 7)

- Policies for Review of Planning Act and Environmental Assessment Act applications:
 - Using a science-based, integrated watershed management approach
 - Addressing growth, intensification, and redevelopment trends in TRCA watersheds
 - Emphasizing remediation of flood and erosion hazards and enhancement and restoration of natural heritage
 - Maximizing ecosystem services from both built and natural environments
 - Recommendations to approval authorities






Regulatory Role

- Permission from CA for:
 - Development within a regulated area
 - Interference & alterations to watercourses, wetlands, and shorelines
- Regulation Tests:
 - the control of flooding, erosion, dynamic beaches, pollution or the conservation of land will not be affected
- CA Regulation is "applicable law" under Building Code Act
- Basis for TRCA to approve permit applications

Key Messages

- Policies are reflective of current practice based on scientific research and TRCA's integrated watershed management approach
- Policy directions are consistent with provincial legislation and plans, and recent official plan updates
- TRCA offers pre-consultation services to assist landowners contemplating development that may be affected by TRCA policies



LCP Process and Timelines

Winter 2013

- First draft released for stakeholder and public input
- Orientation Sessions held at BCPV

Summer 2013

- Stakeholder consultation meetings based on written comments received
- Draft revised based on feedback

Spring 2014

- Second draft released for stakeholder and public input
- Public Open House at BCPV
- Finalize draft based on feedback

Fall 2014

 Submit final draft to TRCA Board for approval
