

Glen Haffy Conservation Area

Humber River Watershed

The Humber River watershed spans 903 km², stretching from the Niagara Escarpment and Oak Ridges Moraine to Lake Ontario. It provides essential benefits, including drinking water, natural spaces for relaxation, and connections to nature

Oak Ridges Moraine

The Oak Ridges Moraine is a 160 km ridge stretching from the Niagara Escarpment to the Trent River headwaters. Its underground aquifers store rainwater, which resurfaces to supply clean water to most rivers in the Greater Toronto Area.

Niagara Escarpment

The Niagara Escarpment spans 725 km from Queenston to Tobermory on the Bruce Peninsula. Over 1500 species of plants, 325 bird species, 55 animal species and 34 species of reptiles and water life have been identified within the Niagara Escarpment.

Fishing at Glen Haffy

Each year, Glen Haffy raises rainbow trout on-site at our fish hatchery, which are released into the fishing ponds at Glen Haffy Conservation Area and Heart Lake Conservation Area. The proceeds generated by angling fees help fund the fish rearing program.

Picnic Sites

Glen Haffy Conservation Area offers three large picnic areas, including two with shelters, ideal for groups. Visitor Services can help plan your event and recommend catering, rentals, and entertainment.

Nature Trails

Green Trail (1.36 kilometers)

A historic stone staircase leads into the forest valley, where visitors can see and hear wildlife near Humber River tributaries.

Blue Trail (2.5 kilometers)

The Blue Trail connects the fishing ponds, the Bruce Trail, and other paths, with scenic viewpoints overlooking the forest valley below.

Red Trail (2.7 kilometers)

The Red Trail, the longest trail, passes through forests, wetlands, and fields, with scenic views of the Oak Ridges Moraine and Niagara Escarpment.

Bruce Trail (4.06 kilometers)

Canada's oldest and longest footpath, managed by the Bruce Trail Association, passes through Glen Haffy, connecting the Niagara Escarpment to the Palgrave Side Trail.

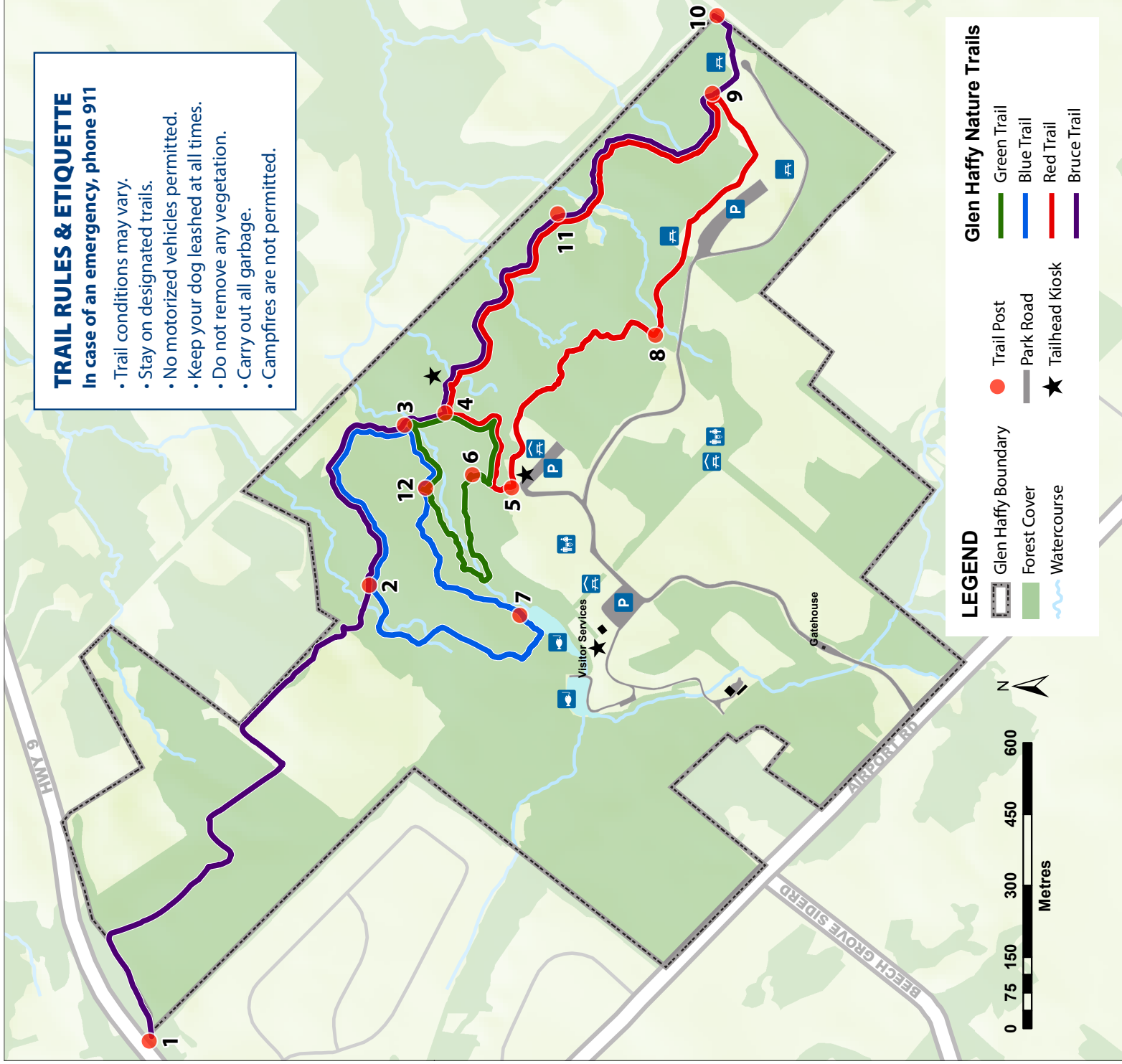
